4. *How should we respond to occult activity?*

We cannot persuade people to do anything; however, the Holy Spirit can. That's why prayer is so important. Our response to cults should be holy anger expressed in prayer to a holy God. Allow God to do His work on our campus. Be people of prayer. You and I shouldn't fight with harsh actions. Picket signs are not the answer. Ephesians 6:10-18 says a lot about another kind of warfare, a warfare that believes in an awesome, all-powerful God. Believe in Him to change lives on our campus.
